


1. Blest are the hun-gry; they shall be fed; Je - sus a feast has kind-ly spread;

3. Sweet in - vi - ta - tion! How can we slight Him who will make our path so bright?




Come and re - ceive; on - ly be - lieve; Je - sus will free - ly, free - ly give.
